

WHAT IS IT?

A File Transfer/Disc Sharing Utility




- Makes desktop's discs available to The Portable.
- Makes The Portable discs available to desktops.


PACKARD

WHAT IS IT?

A Peripheral Sharing Utility




Allows desktops to use HP-IL peripherals.



Allows The Portable to use peripherals attached to desktop.

WHAT IS IT?

The Portable Information Sharing Utility



■ Allows file sharing by The Portables via HP-IL.

WHAT YOU GET

- HP-IL interface for the IBM PC (P/N 82973A)
 - □ An HP-IL interface card
 - ☐ HP-IL installable device driver
 - □ HP LINK program
 - Manual
- Extended I/O accessory (P/N 45643A)
 - ☐ Same as above
 - □ Plus Centronics type parallel interface



INSTALLATION

Desktop as Controller of HP-IL Peripherals

- 1. Install HP-IL interface in desktop.
- 2. Copy HPIL.SYS to boot disc.
- 3. Create CONFIG.SYS on desktop containing
 DEVICE=HPIL.SYS
- 4. Re-boot the desktop.

INSTALLATION

Desktop as Peripheral of The Portable

- Boot desktop without
 DEVICE=HPIL.SYS
 in the CONFIG.SYS file.
- 2. Put PDL disc in A: and type HPLINK
- 3. On The Portable, set

 External Disc Drives: 2

 in System Config menu; then exit menu.
 - 4. Type

DIR C:

and it will read the desktop's A: drive.



PRACTICUM

Install the HP-IL interface in a

desktop PC and use the PC's discs

from The Portable.

USING THE PORTABLE AS DISCS FOR DESKTOP

1. On The Portable, type

HPLINK

(It's in ROM.)

2. Boot desktop (with disc with HPIL.SYS).

3. Use The Portable as disc from desktop. Try

DIR C:



PORTABLE TO PORTABLE

- 1. Connect two Portable's via HP-IL.
- 2. On one, type

HPLINK

3. On the other, set

External Disc Drives: 2

4. Now read from drives C: and D: on the other Portable.

USING A DESKTOP'S PRINTER FROM THE PORTABLE

- 1. On the desktop, run HP LINK and select option
 - 3) Printer

2. On The Portable, set

Printer Interface:

HPIL

Now all Portable printer output goes to the desktop printer.

USING HP-IL PERIPHERALS FROM A DESKTOP

MS-DOS uses device names to talk to hardware on the system. HPIL.SYS defines these device names:

HPILPRN:

HP-IL printer

HPILPLT:

HP-IL 7470 plotter

B:, C:, D:, ... Additional HP-IL discs

or 82161A cassette.



USING HP-IL PERIPHERALS FROM A DESKTOP

Connect an HP-IL printer and

HP-IL disc drive to the IBM PC

and use them.

PDL AND THE IBM PC AT

- It works, sorta. We support it, not at all!
- Can destroy all information on AT's hard disc.
- Safest way to use it is with the AT as the controller.
- Problem caused by MS-DOS 3.XX and 12-versus 16-bit FAT entries.
